### STAAR TESTING

During the next two weeks, 6th, 7th, and 8th graders will be taking STAAR tests. Please see the information below to know when your student will be testing and the information for testing days. Testing is scheduled for 4 hours, which typically occurs between 8:30-12:30. **Monday May 2-Friday May 6th, students will be following a 'C' Day schedule.** The campus will be closed to all visitors.

- Wednesday, May 4th- Students in Algebra 1 will take the Algebra EOC test. \*\*All 6th, 7th and 8th grade students not testing will follow a regular 'C' day schedule.
- Thursday, May 5th- 8th graders will take the STAAR Science test. \*\*All 6th and 7th grade students not testing will follow a regular 'C' Day schedule.
- Friday, May 6<sup>th</sup> STAAR makeup day for students who did not take the Algebra 1 EOC or 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Science STAAR earlier in the week. Any student on campus who missed their test will be expected to make up their STAAR test on this day.

### Testing Students Please Adhere To The Following Guidelines:

- \*Please arrive at your usual time.
- \*Name and room numbers will be posted in the commons and in grade level hallways
- . "Students will be dismissed at 8:10am to go to their testing rooms.
- \*Please bring a FULLY CHARGED District issued AISD Chromebook and charger
- · \*Bring a water bottle
- \*Cell phones and backpacks will need to be placed in lockers before testing begins. Students will
  only need to bring their Chromebook, a book (non-electrictronic), and water bottle to the testing
  room.

### **GMS Tiger Team Parent Lunch Volunteers**

Thank you so much for giving your time to help our campus be even more successful! Your partnership with us is so valuable. All of our students benefit when we work together.

There are 3 lunches:

On all Block schedule days, A Days and B Days:

A lunch = 11:00 - 11:30 = 100% 6th grade students

B lunch = 11:50 - 12:20 = Mixed 7th and 8th grade students, but majority 7th

C lunch = 12:35 - 1:05 = Mixed 7th and 8th grade students, but majority 8th

On C days, Fridays - Notice the time differences:

A lunch = 10:50 - 11:20 = 100% 6th grade students

B lunch = 11:40 - 12:10 = Mixed 7th and 8th grade students, but majority 7th

C lunch = 12:30 - 1:00 = Mixed 7th and 8th grade students, but majority 8th

When you arrive, after you check in with the front office, please find an administrator or counselor (in the cafeteria or commons) who will let you know which location needs help. See tasks below based on location:

- 5 min before they are dismissed remind them to wait until their table is inspected before they leave

### PROCESSES & PROCEDURES

### DROPPING OFF ITEMS AT SCHOOL

In order to assist students with self-responsibility and to keep classroom disruptions to a minimum, GMS does not make deliveries nor do we contact the student while they are in class to let them know that their item was dropped off. You may tell your student before school that you will be dropping off an item or you can email their teacher. The student will then have to pick it up from the front office. (delivery exceptions are contact lenses or glasses).

### PERMIT TO LEAVE SCHOOL EARLY

When students leave school early, written permission from a parent or guardian is required. Please follow these steps:

- The student must bring the note to the front office in the morning to receive a pink slip.
- The student will show the pink slip to the teacher when it is time to leave; the teacher will allow the student to go to the front office for parent pick-up. \*\*Without a pink slip, students are not allowed to leave class\*\*
- Parent/guardian(s) must sign the student out in the front office before leaving campus. Please bring your photo ID.

### AISD ATHLETICS PROTOCOL

There are new updates to how we manage our athletic programs masking requirements are still in place, but capacity limits have been lifted.

Mask requirements: All students, staff, and spectators will be required to wear masks at indoor athletic events unless they're participating in vigorous activity.

- Student-athletes will be masked at all times except when they're playing the sport. That means
  masks are required in the locker room, in meetings, or on the sidelines.
- · The masking requirement applies to all visiting teams and spectators.

Capacity limits: Capacity limits have been lifted as of February 10, 2022.

Health screenings: Student-athletes will be verbally screened daily to confirm everyone at the practice or game feels 100%.

- Student-athletes are expected to self-screen and self-report if they're experiencing any symptoms, including congestion, runny nose, sneezing, or cough.
- . Anyone who has symptoms should not be attending any type of school activity.

We will continue reviewing our protocols to be sure we're maintaining a safe environment for our studentathletes, staff, and community.

### COVID QUARANTINE AND TESTING

### RETURNING TO SCHOOL AFTER TESTING POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Students and staff that have tested positive for Covid-19 will be required to isolate at home for 5 days. The date of the positive test is Day 0 and individuals may return on Day 6. After returning to campus on Day 6, you will be required to wear a mask for 5 additional days per CDC recommendations and AISD policy.

It is not necessary to submit a negative test to return, but students and staff should be 24 hrs. fever free and have improvement in symptoms.

### SYMPTOMATIC / ILL STUDENTS AND STAFF

Staff or students who become ill while on campus may request a rapid covid test on campus. However, please do not come to school ill to get a Covid test or request "peace of mind" testing while on campus. Our health room's priority is meeting the safety and health needs of those currently on campus. There are several testing locations provided by AISD but the closest locations to GMS are:


